Dear Members,

The past year was dominated by participating in two LWVUS consensus studies: Amending the Constitution and Money in Politics. We had public forums, a CAT TV show, and a Lunch and Learn on these topics. We completed our Amending the Constitution consensus meeting on October 28 and the Money in Politics consensus meeting on January 21.

One of our other top priorities for the past year was to promote citizen service on Columbia and Boone County Boards and Commissions. We have had articles in the Voter as well as a Lunch and Learn on this topic.

We also have worked on improving voter registration in Boone County by teaming up with TurboVote. This on-line voter registration site reminds voters of registration deadlines, polling locations, etc. MU has their own TurboVote site. The LWV site is for Boone County colleges, high schools and citizens. We had a voter registration day at Stephens College and are planning high school voter registration.

Fighting Photo Voter ID has been another big issue for our local and state Leagues. We will be preparing our campaign to help defeat any ballot issues that restrict the right to vote.

Thanks for all our volunteers who helped us make this a great year to be a member of the League of Women Voters of Columbia-Boone County.

Public Forums

Our public forums related to the two LWVUS consensus studies: Money in Politics and Constitutional Amendment Process. We were also asked to work with the Columbia/Boone County Board of Health to put on a forum on GMOs.

Special Projects

- Our local League joined other Missouri Leagues and the LWVMO in donating to the Turning Point Suffragist Memorial to be located in the Occoquan Regional Park in northern Virginia. Missouri's total donations were over \$1000, so we will be recognized on the Donor Wall.
- The LWV was asked to act as an impartial entity in running the MU Grad Students vote to determine interest in forming a union. Volunteers ran the two-day election on April 18 and 19 at two locations and counted the votes.
- The Columbia Tribune asked LWV members to facilitate public discussions on how to improve the sense of community in Columbia. This project was funded by the Kettering Foundation.

Fundraising

- Fundraising Play each year with Columbia Entertainment Company. In June 2015 our play was "Lucky Stiff," and we raised nearly \$4,000.
- The MU Grad Student vote was also a fundraiser, as we were paid \$1500 for our volunteers' time and effort.
