SEPTEMBER 12: THE DECLINE OF THE WARREN COURT AND THE RISE OF THE NEOLIBERAL ORDER

The speaker for the Kinder Institute's annual James E. Fleming and Linda C. McClain Constitution Day Lecture will be Gary Gerstle, Paul Mellon Professor of American History Emeritus and Paul Mellon Director of Research at the University of Cambridge. He will explain how the neoliberal boom in American politics in

the 1980s and 90s required abandoning the support for broad federal regulatory powers at the heart of the mid-century Warren Court's jurisprudence. The September 12 event will be at 5:30 p.m. in the State Historical Society of Missouri's Cook Hall. A reception will begin at 5:00 p.m.

Many thanks to all the enthusiastic members who attended the LWV Fall Gathering. The anniversary of the 19th Amendment was a great occasion to celebrate women's progress and to remind ourselves of the work that still needs to be done.

Although our rights and even our democratic system are being challenged in many ways, we can push back by collaborating with other organizations to encourage informed and active participation in government. We've joined a new Boone County coalition, "Making A Difference One Woman at a Time," to step up voter registration and voter education. Part of that mission is to develop a speaker's bureau, so please think about groups that might like a voter education speaker. (More details on p.5).

The LWV also seeks to influence public policy through nonpartisan advocacy. We plan to help members get more comfortable communicating with elected officials so our voices can be heard more clearly and more often. Stay tuned in the months to come.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE ONE WOMAN AT A TIME

LWVCBC has joined a group planning to promote voter registration, voter education, and voting for women in Boone County. We want to engage women from now until the election days in 2024 (April 4th local election, August 6th primary election, and November 5th general election). At our first planning meeting, we decided that to accomplish this goal we will:

- Have a conference for women to promote the importance of voting and work to address the needs of women voters.
- Form a speakers bureau to visit small organizations to register voters, educate on dis- and misinformation, and provide education for voting.
- Work with schools and colleges to promote voter registration, voter education, and polling information, including having early voting on campus.
- Concretely connect voting to a woman's life.
- · Eliminate obstacles to voting for women.

We want to identify needs in the lives of potential voters and work to make it possible for

them to become actual voters. For instance, some women do not have transportation to the polls, some do not know how to register to vote, some do not know anything about candidates, and some do not know that one vote can change the outcome of an election.
