For the first time in several years, Lunch & Learn will meet on October 11 at noon in the Friends Room of the Columbia Public Library (Zoom option is also available; register at https://events.dbrl.org/event/9020824).

Kathy Kiely, the Lee Hills Chair in Free Press Studies at the Missouri School of Journalism, will speak about the "50th Anniversary of the Missouri Sunshine Law, a Cornerstone of Democracy." Learn about the bipartisan origins of our Freedom of Information Act (aka Sunshine Law), how it is used to keep the public informed about government actions, and potential changes that could dilute the law. This event is the annual Holly Burgess Public Policy Forum

co-sponsored by the Columbia Public Library and the American Association of University Women (AAUW)-Columbia Branch.

The November 8 Lunch & Learn program, also in the Friends' Room and via Zoom, will feature Steve Hunt, Manager of the City of Columbia's Solid Waste Utility, talking about solid waste and recycling.

At the excellent Constitution Day program on September 21, we were fortunate to hear from a number of Columbia College students about how they choose and navigate online information and attempt to distinguish fact from fiction. Although older people are much more likely to vote than younger people, a recent study showed that when young people are registered, they turn out at high rates, especially in Presidential elections, midterms, and other races where they know what is at stake. According to Census Bureau data, in 2020, a full 86% of registered youth aged 18-24 turned out to vote. And the numbers are similar for presidential elections going back to 2004.

In this context, the League is playing a crucial role in engaging and registering voters in the Columbia public high schools and planning for a more active role on our local college campuses. If you have ideas or contacts in the higher education world who might help, please let me know.

LWV calendar highlights include the October 11 Lunch & Learn program about the 50th Anniversary of the Missouri Sunshine Law and the MU Homecoming Parade on October 21.

We also have the opportunity to honor deserving individuals and groups who have made a difference in the lives of Boone Countians by nominating them for the LWVCBC annual awards. The LWV of Missouri will hold its annual Fall Conference in Columbia on Saturday, November 4, at the Boone Electric Cooperative's new building on Rangeline Street. The theme for this year's hybrid conference is "Information Express: The Train to '24."

The preliminary schedule includes:
