PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The summer, with all its glorious growth and outdoor enjoyment, is a relatively quiet time for LWV activities in a year without major elections. That gives us time to reflect and plan for the future. On June 6, the LWVCBC board met to identify priorities and sketch out the calendar for the rest of our program year. After a robust discussion, we identified several issues to focus on—for example:

Initiative petition process—Although no bill to restrict the right to direct democracy passed during the 2023 session, we fully expect that when the legislature reconvenes in January there will be new proposals to make the initiative petition process harder. We need to educate the public about the initiative petition process and why it's important, and help our members advocate effectively on this and other issues.

Presidential candidate selection process— Since the legislature cancelled the Missouri Presidential Primary election, each political party will be in charge of its own selection process (via caucuses or conventions). Voter education will be needed to help people understand how to participate.

Voter registration and education for students and young adults—The photo ID requirements will have a big impact on youthful voters in our community, many of whom do not have Missouri driver's licenses or non-driver IDs. Young people are increasingly motivated to vote but will need education to navigate the system. (See the article about "Paws to the Polls" on page three).

<u>Disinformation</u>—the spread of incorrect, misleading, and downright untruthful information is a real threat to our goal of informed voters. We will build on LWV's reputation as a trusted source and develop new ways to get factual information "out there."

The board also expressed the desire to enhance collaboration with other organizations devoted to specific issues like reproductive health, gun sense, and voter registration. LWV has a lot of policy positions, and it only makes sense to combine forces where we can.

We identified several action steps that will call for member involvement. Please stay tuned and stand ready to volunteer as plans evolve. Meanwhile, stay cool and enjoy a wonderful July.

Luella St. Clair Moss's 158th birthday was June 25. To commemorate her birthday, Meredith Donaldson, Kathryn Allen, and Pam Springsteel arranged this photo and created the paper shown in the picture. It reads: *Happy Birthday Luella, June 25, 1865 - August 18, 1947. Luella St. Clair Moss was prominent in the fields of education, women's suffrage, and politics on the local, state, and national level. We honor you as a leader among women!*

Luella is buried at our Columbia Cemetery, next to her nine-year-old daughter, Anna Lee, and her husband, Franklin Moss.

Our League continues to celebrate the life of educator and suffragist Luella St. Clair Moss and encourage the school board to name a school for her. Kip Kendrick, Boone County Presiding Commissioner, told Pam he plans to send out this photo with his endorsement of Luella's name on the next public school!

"PAWS TO THE POLLS" RECEIVES AWARD AT LWVMO CONVENTION

The Harriett Woods Award for Exemplary Community Service went to Dr. Suzanne Walker-Pacheco for the MSU Paws to the Polls program. An anthropology professor, Dr. Walker-Pacheco mentors a group of Missouri State University students working to promote voting. The nonpartisan program refers to the MSU mascot, the Bears, and raised student voting by increasing voter knowledge, voter engagement, and civic commitment. Tactics include studentled modules in Freshman Foundation classes. Dr. Walker-Pacheco offered to help other local

Leagues do similar work and provided samples of materials they use. She shared that her mother was a League member who took her to her first League meeting when she was eight months old!
